REVISED RELIGIOUS STUDIES MINOR

The Religious Studies department used to offer three distinct minors: Religious Studies Minor, Theology Minor, and Catholic Studies Minor. Beginning with the Fall 2023 catalog, the Religious Studies Minor and the Theology Minor will be eliminated and replaced with a new, revised Religious Studies Minor. The new minor is designed as a mini version of the major with the exact same core requirements. The change is meant to make it easy for minors to switch to a Religious Studies Major or vice versa. Students should be able to complete the minor within two years either entirely in person or entirely online (or a combination of the two). The Catholic Studies Minor remains unchanged.
